

Japan Schopenhauer Association Award

(Commemorating the 150th anniversary of Schopenhauer's death)

Outline

This award, commemorating the 150th anniversary of Schopenhauer's death, will be awarded to the writer of an article which is evaluated as exceptionally contributing to Schopenhauer research, or an excellent academic essay related to Schopenhauer.



Entry Rules and Regulations

Entry Qualifications: Any person who is 40 years old or under with an interest in Schopenhauer's philosophy (non-association members are also eligible).^(*)

Main Prize: Award Certificate

Additional Prizes: **500,000 yen** (approximately **5751 US dollars**), 2 year official membership to the association (2011-2012).

Entry Deadline: **January 31, 2011**

Permitted Languages: **Japanese, German, English**

Judging Panel: Japan Schopenhauer Association Editorial Committee.

Publication of Essays: The winning essay will be published in the Japan Schopenhauer Association journal, "Schopenhauer Studien". A selected number of non-winning articles, deemed to be of high quality by the editorial committee, will also be published in the same journal.

Award Ceremony: To be held at the general assembly of the 2011 Japan Schopenhauer Association National Symposium.

Entry Guidelines.

1. Unpublished works related to Schopenhauer, or works contributing to Schopenhauer research. We propose that both essays and articles follow academic writing conventions.
2. Essays (notes included) shall be no more than 40,000 Japanese characters in length (18,000 words for German and English essays).
3. Please save your entry on electronic media such as floppy disk, and send, enclosed with a printed copy, to the Japan Schopenhauer Association Office. (For overseas entries, or those who have difficulty in accessing postal services, please send as an attachment via email, with "Japan Schopenhauer Association Award Entry" in the subject line.
4. On the entry's cover sheet, please include the title of the essay, your name, occupation or affiliation, date of birth, contact address, telephone number and email address. For Japanese language entries, please include a German title and your name in Romanized script.
5. Please send entries to the Japan Schopenhauer Association by January 31, 2011. The editorial committee will judge entries and decide the winner. Notification of results will be made by the office. Entries will not be returned.
6. The Japan Schopenhauer Association will hold the copyright of the winning entry, and in addition to publication in the association journal may partially, or fully publish the text on the association website, and store and publicize via association electronic media, for purposes of promoting Schopenhauer research.
